In a massive team effort, they revived the garden, build wooden garden furniture and worked on metal constructions.

Eating, learning any playing in times of a global pandemic

A children's restaurant is turned into a takeaway and manages to stay in contact with the youths – despite lockdown.

Enjoying a healthy, warm, home-cooked meal every day is something many children from socially disadvantaged backgrounds cannot take for granted. At the Lunch Club, they not only get precisely that – they also receive support and structure in their day-to-day lives as well as help with schoolwork, and their families are given guidance and assistance.

While the country was put under lockdown, those responsible immediately reinvented the concept in order to continue to support children and families, especially during this difficult time. They stayed in touch by phone. The children picked up freshly prepared meals for their family from the Lunch Club. And the Lunch Club even regularly offered challenges via Zoom: from healthy cooking with the ingredients provided, to joint online yoga classes, to virtual carnival celebrations, for which the children were allowed to pick up the costumes they wanted from the Lunch Club.

This way, families are being guided through the pandemic and never feel let down: they continue to receive help in everyday life, while the children can eat healthy meals, learn together and keep on seeing their friends. A great idea well implemented!

Albania

SOS Children's Village Tirana Healthy food and education for vulnerable children

Healthy food, reliable health care and the chance to get an education – these are essential pillars of life that many children in Albania are denied due to widespread poverty. The SOS Children's Village Tirana offers children and families a safe and caring environment, access to education, a balanced diet and psychosocial support.

In 2021, SOS Children's Village Tirana provided 180 children with access to health care, education and quality leisure time. From foreign language courses to summer schools – children develop their individual interests

and talents in a child-friendly environment and have taken an important step towards a future full of opportunities.

As part of the local SOS family strengthening programme, families also received holistic support, helping them to take care of their children and to feed them healthy.

SOS Children's Village Chantevent

Day-to-day life in a pandemic

The pandemic hit the children at the SOS Children's Village Chantevent particularly hard. Contact to their families of origin and outside friends as well as external activities were severely limited over several months. The effects the pandemic had on the outside world were soon noticeable on the inside: new children from vulnerable families were welcomed to the village because family structures were severely tested and, in some cases, destabilized during lockdown.

SOS Children's Villages Vari / Heraklion (Crete)


The story of Mazin - a child who dares to dream big

The 15-year-old Mazin lives in the SOS Children's Village Vari. Since 2021, he has been attending the first class of the local Senior High School – a new environment that initially scared him. But with the help of his teacher and his SOS mum, he has managed to overcome his fear. Mazin is determined and always wants to improve. He is one of the best pupils in his class. His favourite subjects are maths and computer science. One day, Mazin wants to become a professional football player, and he is doing everything to realise this dream. He is always on time for

training, and he plays with great passion. "When Mazin scores a goal, he is so thrilled," his SOS mum explains. Nevertheless, he also wants to study computer science alongside playing football. Mazin is a child who dares to dream big. And that's something his SOS mum admires in him.

This is just one of many stories from the SOS Children's Village Vari, where children learn to overcome traumatic and difficult experiences and can find a happy life full of opportunities. The donations were used to finance the therapy and counselling sessions for all children and care givers in Vari and also some of the counselling sessions for the children and care givers at the SOS Children's Village in Heraklion.

SOS Children's Village Bucharest

Needs-based psychotherapy for traumatised children

The SOS Children's Village in Bucharest takes an individualised, needs-based approach to help children with traumatic experiences. In weekly sessions, the therapists establish a close relationship with the children – an important experience and an essential need for children suffering from fears of loss. Throughout the therapy – which the LR Global Kids Fund funded for ten children in 2021 – the personal needs of the young patients have been prioritized. For instance, the sessions took place one-on-one or in groups, depending on the children's preferences. The

therapy rooms were also individually set up, giving each youngster the feeling of a safe and comfortable environment. In this familiar atmosphere, past events were discussed, and ways of dealing with post-traumatic stress were trained. And successfully the children became emotionally stronger, gained more confidence and learned to gradually live a normal life.



SOS Children's Village Pushkin

From music classes to fairy tale therapy a whole range of options for all ages

Every child, every age, every experience needs to be dealt with differently. But they all have one thing in common: they all want to play, learn, develop and lead a life filled with opportunities. The SOS Children's Village Pushkin employs various types of art therapy to allow the children to develop their individual talents while at the same time helping them to overcome their sometimes traumatic experiences from the past.

Pre-school children receive sensory and cognitive support in order to prepare optimally for starting school. Through



fairy tale therapy, primary school-age children learn to recognise and control their emotions. And with the help of film screenings, bibliotherapy and creative methods, young teenagers explore their own personality, analyse actions and learn to understand motives. A special emphasis is placed on the development of communication skills and overcoming fear.

In the SOS Children's Village Pushkin children learn how to handle past experiences through music. The aim is to ensure a comprehensive and harmonious development of each child. Listening attentively as well as understanding the emotional and sensual aspects of music have a positive effect on the mental health of children of all ages.

SOS Children's Villages Brno and Karlovy Vary

Comprehensive support for traumatised children

Most children in the SOS Children's Village Karlovy Vary have experienced neglect and abuse in the past and therefore suffer from deep-seated trauma. With dedicated teachers and psychologists, the SOS Children's Villages help families to better understand the children's behavioural problems. Simultaneously, the children are lovingly taught how to deal with their feelings and their personal history. Through leisure activities, they discover their potentials, develop their personal talents and learn to love themselves as unique and loved human beings. During the

pandemic, the importance of these measures became particularly clear: leisure activities and private lessons became very important, ensuring the children didn't fall behind at school or feel isolated.

Ukraine

SOS Children's Village Kyiv (Brovary) Multifaceted support for overcoming traumatic experiences

In the Ukrainian SOS Children's Village in Brovary near the capital of Kyiv, the need for psychological aid support huge. Many children have experienced violence in their past or were neglected. The consequences of these experiences are drastic and are often expressed in severe aggression, low self-esteem, fear of loss, bed-wetting or other behavioural disorders and mental illnesses.

International projects

Various types of support such as art, sand and bodyoriented therapies as well as classic psychotherapy are

used to help the children. In 2021, our donation was used for over 600 hours of therapy for 16 children. In addition, 186 children and 88 parents received valuable psychosocial support through various counselling and therapy offers as part of the family strengthening programme. A project that is of great value and will become more important than ever due to the war in Ukraine.

SOS Children's Village Daegu Learning English for a brighter future

Education is the key to a successful future as well as the basis for a life without poverty. The SOS Children's Village Daegu and the LR Global Kids Fund enable children to access valuable educational offerings and help them to broaden their cultural horizons and and to develop their individual

In 2021, 17 primary school children of the SOS Children's Village took part in an online English language course. One of the aims of the initiative was to effectively help the children develop independent learning skills. In addition, their foreign language skills and intercultural skills

were strengthened. In online one-on-one video lessons, native speakers taught the children practical skills for real-life conversations. The children's English skills were significantly improved, and the experience was a lot of fun. Not only did the children achieve outstanding results in the test after the course, but their general interest in the language also increased enormously - a great foundation for the children's general ability to learn.

Theodora e. V.

Laughing children and sweet dreams with the Dream Doctors

Laughter is the best medicine. But this can be difficult to remember when you're ill or injured and lying in a bed in hospital. Which is why the 75 professional artists of the Theodora Foundation visit 60 medical facilities across Switzerland. Every week. Their mission: helping children forget that they are in hospital and enticing them into the colourful world of fantasy and laughter.

Tailored to each child's individual needs and condition, the Dream Doctors act out a spontaneous play that allows the

young patients to laugh and forget their worries. Even shortly before and after operations, the Dream Doctors are there for their protégés. With heaps of empathy, they manage to transform these difficult moments into a fantasy adventure and calm both children and parents.

Other programmes of the Theodora Foundation include "Mr and Mrs Dream", two sweet, playful, lyrical characters, who spend time with children with disabilities and accompany them into their personal dream world. "The Little Orchestra of the Senses" transforms any ward into an interactive musical, which even has the on-duty nurses dancing and singing along. And the "Little Champs" help and encourage youths who are overweight, accompanying them on their journey to a healthier lifestyle.

Bulgaria

"For our children" organisation Welcome to the Children's House!

The temporary children's home for babies and children by the "For our children" organisation offers children from difficult backgrounds loving care, security and a family-like environment for a happy and healthy childhood. The long-term aim is either to reintegrate the children into their biological family or to find a kind-hearted foster family.

Children who end up at the Children's House have either been left behind, experienced domestic violence or are street urchins or orphans. At the Children's House, they

enter a new and unfamiliar world – a world with regular warm meals, hugs, education and children's yoga in the mornings. Experts in therapeutic work such as speech therapists, psychologists and special education teachers support the children with a lot of attention and patience, enabling them to overcome trauma and develop healthily. In 2021, eleven children received the support they needed, thanks to the donations from the LR Global Kids Fund.

Italy

L'Albero della Vita Casa ZeroSei – a safe haven for children in dire straits

Children who live in difficult circumstances deserve protection and shelter. Transforming problems into new opportunities – this is the aim of the **ZeroSei House for children** who got separated from their families. The place was established in 2002 in Milan and has since accommodated more than 120 children between nought and six years of age who were removed from their families. Often, the children who end up at ZeroSei are victims of mistreatment, domestic violence or abuse. Here, these children are welcome. They stay for up to three years, before they are either

reintegrated into their own family or start living with a foster family. The employees at Casa ZeroSei try to establish the feeling of comfort and security a family usually provides. The children experience a safe, stable living environment in which the children's individuality and confidence is nurtured. Here, they can discover their own potential, push the envelope, develop further and build value-based relationships with their (new) family, school and community.

The parents are not always solely to blame for the difficulties the families run into. The country's economic, educational and social poverty is often at fault. For many years, the charity CADV – which runs many other projects to protect minors in addition to the ZeroSei House – has been fighting to protect the weakest members of society.

Etoile des Neiges

Sports to combat cystic fibrosis

When children fall ill with a serious disease, this is often trying for the families, both psychologically and financially. The French charity "Etoiles des Neiges" accompanies children with cystic fibrosis and enables them to take advantage of cutting-edge therapies when their families are unable to afford them.

Cystic fibrosis is considered incurable and ends in premature death. But thanks to new treatments, sufferers now have a life-expectancy of roughly 40 years. For the first

time ever, a new and promising therapy called Trikafta is able to help even seriously ill patients significantly. Since 2021, "Etoiles des Neiges" accompanies seriously ill patients who embark on this therapy and provides each with a personal fitness coach for four months. Because the therapy is most effective in combination with plenty of sports: patients with less than 30 % lung capacity awaiting double lung transplantation have been able to increase their lung capacity to 70 %, gain weight and reduce or even stop oxygen, antibiotics, and other treatments. A genuine ray of hope for a healthier future!

CliniClowns

Laughter and sleep are the best medicine

Imagine you are lying in a hospital bed. It is winter, you are eight years old, and you can't sleep. The bed is unfamiliar, you are alone, uneasy and frightened. You know sleep is important for you to get better, particularly because you're having an operation tomorrow and should be well rested.

But what's that? A sweet melody suddenly wafts down the hallway. A red nose pops round the door, then a colourful lantern. A clown on tiptoes enters silently, decorated with a string of fairy lights. CliniClown Pom has come for a visit and gives young Sophie the strength and confidence



she needs for a good night's sleep. For a moment, Sophie can forget all her worries. She is finally able to relax and fall asleep. The new CliniClowns project is called "Bedtime Visits" and was developed in a dark time – a time in which distractions and joy are more important than ever, particularly for children. For several years now, the CliniClowns have been able to visit children and people with dementia in almost all hospitals and care facilities in the Netherlands – thanks to the help of supporters such as the LR Global Kids Fund and a well-established cooperation with the healthcare system. They guarantee joy and fun and allow people to forget illness and pain for a short while. They raise people's spirits and give them strength to overcome fears, worries and the feeling of loneliness.

Austria

SoWo (Soziales Wohnhaus) Neunkirchen "Reif für die Insel" – ready for a time-out

A small island, a place to retreat and to unwind – with the help of the LR Global Kids Fund, the young inhabitants of the SoWo in Neunkirchen, Austria, made this dream come true.

The SoWo is home to youths from the age of 14 who no longer live with their family. Here, they find shelter and practical help. In 2021, on top of many long-term character-forming projects, the project "Reif für die Insel" was launched.

About the project: a section of the SoWo premises – a "peninsula" – had become overgrown over the years. Here, under the professional guidance of experts, the youngsters created a lovingly designed garden with their own furniture and works of art made from pallets and scrap metal. A colourful hammock and a herb garden for the home's own use complete this feel-good oasis. "Successfully creating something from scratch is an experience many inhabitants of the SoWo have never had before," explains Daniele Leinweber from SoWo Neunkirchen.

The project was about more than "merely" creating a pleasant haven. The youths learned about the pleasures of everyday work and being productive. They learned special skills and created something useful. They created a network beyond social media, collaborated, learned to accept differences and gained self-knowledge as well as social

and professional skills.

Without the LR Global Kids Fund donation, this project would not have been possible. "For you, we are 'one of many projects'. But for us, you are the most important cooperation partner."

Dom Aniołów Stróżów

House of Guardian Angels

Poverty and dysfunctional families often go hand in hand. Unemployment, addiction, crime, domestic violence – the problems of families in the poor districts of Katowice and Chorzów frequently trigger one another. Parents in this situation struggle with doing justice to their duty of care.

Their children react with aggressive behaviour, social withdrawal, hyperactivity or developing problems at school. Children growing up in these circumstances tend to have low self-esteem or feel incompetent as they become adults. They repeat their parents' mistakes, fail to set boundaries, become aggressive towards their children or neglect them emotionally and in terms of hygiene, health and education.

The result is a negative spiral that is hard to escape from. The "House of Guardian Angels" is open to these socially excluded children and families from the poorest neighbourhoods in Katowice and Chorzów. Here, we offer early advice and support and, where necessary, we intervene or provide therapy. Qualified professionals at the family support centre provide individual counselling and offer workshops

for the families who desperately need them. The families receive advice on raising their children, help in crises and mediation. But there are also workshops on improving communication, household management, legal support and ideas for joint projects to strengthen the bond between parents and child – all based on an individual assessment of the problems and tailored to each family's needs.

Hungary

Csányi Foundation

A language trip without leaving the country

Getting an education and learning foreign languages is particularly hard for children from socially deprived families. Which is why the Hungarian Csányi Foundation helps promote the language skills of disadvantaged children and youths aged between ten and 24.

The pandemic called for extra creativity. A trip to foreign language schools became impossible. Which is why the Csányi Foundation organised a foreign language trip to the Hungarian town of Mohács. Here, the children and

youths acquired Hungarian, German and English language skills and learned about the different countries' cultures in a playful and exploratory

There was also plenty of fun and games, including leisure activities such as canoeing, swimming and dance evenings. The subsequent test results and the positive feedback from the children prove that a language trip in your own country can be just as enjoyable and successful as one that takes you abroad.

This way, the Hungarian charity managed to kill two birds with one stone: enabling children to acquire language skills and have a whale of a time despite a global pandemic.
